The store is specific to women's and juniors and includes brand name and designer clothing, handbags, footwear and accessories.

During the Grand Opening which will last through May 1st, shoppers will be treated to gift basket raffles and there is a coupon for discounts of 10% when spending over \$20 and a gift coupon for future purchases. So in addition to saving on the retail purchase, there is motivation to keep coming back. According to Denise, "This is retail therapy without the guilt! On the Soap Box: The return of the farmers market

On June 13th, the Jamesburg Farmers Market will return for the second season of fresh veggies and fruit, but in a new location. The new venue will be in the parking lot of the Presbyterian Church on the corner of Church and Gatzmer. This is a good thing because the space is well suited to a market of this sort, there is parking on the street and in the back of the church. We will miss the visibility of West Railroad in proximity with Rt. 522 but the new venue takes the pressure off the police department from having to worry about us. The safety concerns of the police are admirable, considering that according to the USDA there were 4,685 registered farmers markets in the United States in 2008 and the USDA confirms that these markets boosted the local economy. Our market was the 99th to be registered in NJ last year. Of all the markets across the country, there has only been one major incident, it did involve a fatality, in San Diego a number of years ago.

That's okay, we hope to have a great time in the parking lot. We hope to succeed with more vendors and still be able to direct customers to businesses in town. The market will be open every Saturday from 9AM until 2PM, unless the weather is too severe for the tents. You can't get it fresher than picked the morning of or the night before! Unlike the supermarkets, Jersey fresh is anywhere from 3-5 days old when it hits the shelf. It does not come from the farm to the store. The farmer sells to a wholesaler who brokers a deal to the store chain. Also, the local grower at the farmers markets do not have 100,000 plus items on the shelf to make a profit, so they can lower prices on produce, much of which gets tossed out as it spoils. Buying fresh at the market insures a longer life for your produce in your home. We look forward to seeing you this summer and fall at the market.
