Street Festival Committee news!

The Jamesburg Street Festival Committee has been working to coordinate the annual event which will take place on Sunday, September 20, 2009. Spearheaded by Councilman Brian Grimes and JRC President Elliott Stroul, residents and merchants are being asked to participate in a family fun filled day. Beginning with the Buckelew 5K early Sunday morning, the activities already in place for the event will be an ice cream eating contest sponsored by Mendoker's Bakery, a battle of the bands sponsored by the Academy of Music, a car show hosted by the Elks Club, a pet parade sponsored by our local Vet, a dunking booth provided by the Soden Agency, a pizza eating competition and an extreme makeover sponsored by 40-1 Salon. There will be a food court, kids land and Merchantville as well. Local store owners are invited to be open if they wish to be a part of the celebration at no charge for setting up in front of their own store front. Registration packets are now available by calling Elliott Stroul at 732-512-7417. There is a small registration fee; \$10 for a 10'X10' booth for non-profit organizations and \$20 for-profit vendors. Food handlers must comply with Borough and County regulations and must obtain proper permits from the Borough and Fire Department if applicable. Registration fees will defer the costs of signage, printing and postage. The hope is that the market will remain on West Railroad Avenue between Church and Harrison Streets as this is the most visible place for a viable market in town. It attracts a large number of shoppers who spent money in our restaurants and shops as well as stocking up on same day or previous night picked fruits and vegetables. There is strong interest for other specialty vendors of consumables to fill up more spaces this year and it is hoped that a quick resolution will allow the market to proceed with the business of bringing people into downtown to shop as successfully as it did last year.

March recipe: make your own fresh red sauce

This one is real simple.
